What's PPOM?

Pensacola Parents of Multiples is a non-profit organization established to provide support and assistance to all parents of multiples and their families. We provide **emotional support and encouragement**. We offer information on various **educational topics** relating to having and caring for multiples. We also offer **social interaction** with other parents and families with multiples. These services are for all parents of multiples and expecting parents regardless of membership status in our organization. Membership includes local, state, and national organizations. You will receive 12 issues of the club newsletter, Multiple Mayhem (by email unless specified by mail), and 6 issues of the National Notebook. Members have reduced participation fees at the two biannual club consignment sales and also get early shopping privileges at the sales.

PPOM behavior policies

Please read both sections and sign at bottom.

CHILDREN'S BEHAVIOR POLICY

1. We all need to remember to focus on the behavior and not on the individual. Each parent is responsible for her own child's behavior.

2. Unacceptable behaviors include (but are not limited to) hitting, pushing, scratching, kicking, biting, spitting, slapping, hitting with objects, pulling hair, destroying property, inappropriate touch, or overly aggressive behavior.

3. When disciplining, please remove the child from the immediate area. If after a half an hour from the original incident, the behavior does not cease, the child and parent shall leave for the day.

4. If a child is consistently having behavioral problems that has warranted their removal from several activities, the parent may be asked to refrain from attending events until that child's aggressive or anti-social behavior is under control.

5. If a child is deemed a danger to themselves or other children on a continual basis, the parent may be asked to leave the group.

MOMS BEHAVIOR POLICY

The purpose of the Code of Conduct is to establish guidelines for members at all PPOM functions or when interacting with other members.

1. The whole reason this group exists is for us moms of multiples to support each other and have fun! As with all groups, there is bound to be conflict and strong opinions, but please remember to be considerate of your fellow members, especially those putting in the extra time and effort required to plan events and keep the group running smoothly.

2. As a support group, there will be many conversations with and about members. No negative gossip, physical or obscene gestures, demeaning comments, obscene or abusive verbal language directed toward any other member of the group or their child(ren) are allowed in person, via phone or e-mail. Please also respect the privacy of members who do not have an outgoing nature.

3. All members shall be considerate and respectful of the property of other members.

4. Members shall not misuse the PPOM roster or its contents. If a member is part of the PPOM board, they are permitted to send group e-mails regarding their office to those on the roster; otherwise, all e-mails must be sent to the president. The president will then decide if the information is so time-sensitive to be forwarded to all members immediately or can be addressed in the next regular meeting.

5. Members who sign up to attend an activity and then discover they cannot attend should contact the social chair or activity host as soon as possible to let them know.

6. Members shall be responsible for any fees incurred from bounced checks.

7. Members may not solicit sales or advertise for home-based businesses at any PPOM activities. This includes, but is not limited to, sending general invites to members (either by e-mail or mail) distributing business cards or sales catalogs/flyers. Members may advertise their home-based business through the "Advertisement" section of the newsletter only. Consult the Advertisement section of the newsletter or the Editor for rates.

8. You are responsible for reading and following the by-laws of this group at PPOM activities.

9. You are responsible for your children at all PPOM functions. If you cannot supervise them both/all, please talk to other members ahead of time to see if they can lend a hand, or bring a relative or other helper/babysitter to assist you.

10. When disciplining your children, please speak in a quiet voice or remove the children from the area. Loud voices and yelling are upsetting to other children and disruptive. Please remove your children from the area for time-outs.

11. Do not discipline another mom's children without her permission. In the event that your child is in conflict with another child, please separate them and take the other child to his/her mother.

12. If you have a problem with another member of the group or their children, please address that member directly and discreetly as soon as possible. Please attempt a joint resolution of the issue. If you have a problem concerning the group (activities, meetings, etc.), please address the President or other member of the board as soon as possible.

13. If after an attempt at a resolution the issue remains, members should present concerns about the group, activities, other members or members' children in confidence to the PPOM Board only. Such concerns should be submitted in writing or verbally at a Board meeting and include recommendations for a resolution.

14. To ensure the comfort of moms from all economic and cultural backgrounds, we ask that all members follow the above guidelines. In the unfortunate event that these guidelines are not followed, the witnessing party shall contact the PPOM Board which will discuss the issue with the member(s) involved and has the authority to impose penalties as follows:

a. First Offense – Verbal Warning
b. Second Offense – Written Warning
c. Third Offense within one calendar year – 30-Day Suspension. The member will be allowed the opportunity to state her case before the Board and/or Membership before the Board is allowed to revoke membership. If the problem is not resolved after the 30-Day Suspension, the member will be asked to leave PPOM and her dues will be forfeited. Members choosing to appeal will be notified of the date the Board will meet to discuss and vote on the appeal. The member is strongly encouraged to attend this meeting. A unanimous decision is required to deny the appeal.

Ear infection vaccine shows promise

Vaccines delivered via droplets rubbed into the skin appear to protect against ear infections, say researchers who tested the method on chinchillas.

If this approach proves effective in humans, it could provide a simple, inexpensive way of preventing ear infections, the researchers said.

Three groups of chinchillas had droplets of the vaccines rubbed into the skin of their ears once a week for three weeks. A fourth group received a placebo. After receiving the vaccines or placebo, the animals were infected with nontypeable haemophilus influenzae (NTHi), one of the three main bacterial causes of otitis

media, an infection/inflammation of the middle ear.

The chinchillas that received the vaccines were able to very rapidly reduce, or eliminate NTHi from their nose and ears, but this wasn't the case in the animals that received the placebo. The findings were presented May 21 at the American Society for Microbiology annual meeting, in Philadelphia.

It is estimated that up to 83 percent of children in the United States will have at least one ear infection by the time they're 3.

Product recalls

Large trampolines: Skywalker Holdings has announced a recall of about 60,000 13-foot square trampolines. The straps supporting the top of the trampoline's enclosure to the poles can fail. The enclosure could drop if these straps break, posing a risk that a user could fall from the trampoline. Skywalker Holdings has received at least 250 reports of straps breaking. No injuries have been reported.

The unit has blue spring pads, a black net enclosure, and a jumping mat. The words "Skywalker Holdings" are printed on a label located under the jumping mat and on the enclosure net.

The trampolines were sold at specialty stores and major retailers nationwide and online from January 2007 through February 2009 for between \$400 and \$600.

Youth model ATVs: Fushin USA has announced a recall of about 650 Fushin youth model ATVs. The recalled ATVs lack front brakes, a tire pressure gauge, and padding to cover the sharp edges on the handlebar assembly, which could pose a risk of injury to young riders. No injuries have been reported.

The recall involves the size 90cc youth ATV with model number FXSA 002A-90cc. It comes in a variety of colors. The ATVs were sold at Fushin dealerships and online nationwide from October 2005 through May 2006 for between \$250 and \$350.
